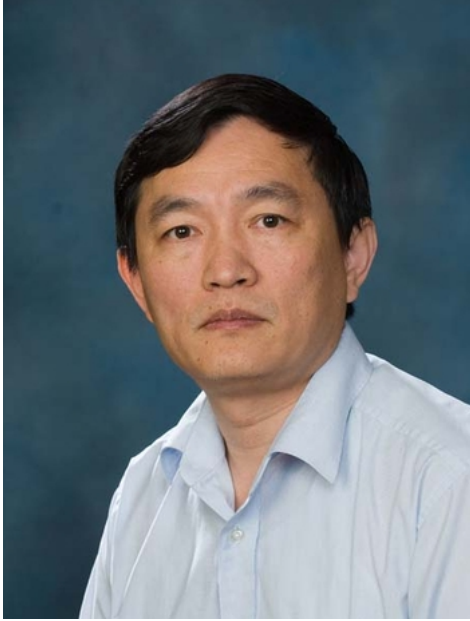
Nomination Acceptance Statement:
